all /ɔ:l/ **A1**

все

the whole amount or every one of a group

All the students passed the exam.

Все студенты сдали экзамен.

another /ə'nʌðə/ **A1**

ещё один

one more of the same thing; a different person or thing

Can I have another cup of tea, please?

Можно ещё одну чашку чая, пожалуйста?

any /'eni/ **A1**

какой-нибудь

used in questions and negatives to refer to one or some of a thing

Do you have any questions?

Есть ли у вас какие-нибудь вопросы?

anybody /'enibɒdi/ **A1**

кто-нибудь

any person at all; used in questions and negatives

Is there anybody who can help me with this problem?

Есть ли кто-нибудь, кто может мне помочь с этой проблемой?

anyone /'eniwʌn/ **A1**

кто-нибудь

any person; used in questions and negatives to refer to any person at all

Is anyone home?

Кто-нибудь дома?

anything /'eniθɪŋ/ **A1**

что-нибудь

used in questions and negative statements to mean 'any thing at all'

Is there anything I can help you with?

Могу я вам чем-нибудь помочь?

anywhere /'eniweə/ **A2**

где-нибудь

in, at, or to any place; used in questions and negative sentences

I can't find my keys anywhere — have you seen them?

Я нигде не могу найти ключи — вы их не видели?

both /bəʊθ/ **A1**

оба

used to refer to two people or things at the same time

Both sisters are doctors.

Обе сестры – врачи.

each /i:tʃ/ **A1**

каждый

every one of two or more people or things, considered separately

Each student received a certificate.

Каждый студент получил сертификат.

each other /i:tʃ 'ʌðə/ **A2**

друг друга

used to show that each person does something to the other(s)

They looked at each other.

Они посмотрели друг на друга.

either /'aɪðə/ **A1**

либо

one or the other of two people or things; both (in negative sentences: not one or the other)

You can go either way; both are correct.

Вы можете идти любым путём; оба правильны.

every /'evri/ **A1**

каждый

used to refer to all members of a group or all parts of something

I exercise every day.

Я занимаюсь спортом каждый день.

everybody /'evribɒdi/ **A1**

все

every person; all people

Everybody enjoyed the party last night.

Все повеселились на вечеринке вчера вечером.

everyone /'evriwʌn/ **A1**

все

all people; every person

Everyone enjoyed the party.

Все получили удовольствие от вечеринки.

everything /'evriθɪŋ/ **A1**

всё

all things; all that exists or is relevant

Everything was quiet when she arrived home.

Когда она вернулась домой, всё было тихо.

everywhere /'evriweə/ **A1**

езде

in, at, or to every place

I looked everywhere but couldn't find my keys.

Я искала везде, но не смогла найти ключи.

few /fju:/ **A2**

несколько

a small number of; not many

Only a few students passed the difficult test.

Только несколько студентов сдали трудный тест.

he hi: **A1**

он

used to refer to a male person or animal that has already been mentioned or is known about

He is my brother.

Он мой брат.

her /hɜ:/ **A1**

её

objective form of 'she'; also used as possessive determiner

I gave her the book. It's her bag.

Я дал ей книгу. Это её сумка.

hers /hɜ:z/ **A1**

её (притяжательное)

used to refer to something belonging to or associated with a female person

That blue umbrella is hers — I can see her name on it.

Этот синий зонт её — я вижу её имя на нём.

herself /hɜ:'self/ **A2**

себя

used when the subject of the verb is a woman or girl and is the same person as the object

She made herself a cup of tea.

Она приготовила себе чашку чая.

him /hɪm/ (A1)

его

objective form of 'he'

I called him yesterday.

Я позвонил ему вчера.

himself /hɪm'self/ (A2)

себя

used as the object of a verb or preposition when the subject is male and the action is done to the same person; used to emphasise a male subject

He hurt himself playing football.

Он ушибся, играя в футбол.

his /hɪz/ (A1)

его

belonging to or associated with a male person already mentioned

Tom left his bag on the chair.

Том оставил свою сумку на стуле.

i /aɪ/ (A1)

я

used by a speaker to refer to himself or herself

I am a student.

Я студент.

it /ɪt/ (A1)

он

used to refer to a thing, animal, or situation that has already been mentioned or is known

Where is my book? It is on the table.

Где моя книга? Она на столе.

its /ɪts/ (A1)

его

belonging to or connected with a thing previously mentioned

The dog wagged its tail.

Собака виляла хвостом.

itself /ɪt'self/ (A2)

себя

used as the reflexive form of 'it', or to emphasise a thing or animal

The cat cleaned itself after eating.

Кошка умылась после еды.

little /'lɪtəl/ **A1**

маленький

small in size; not much of something

There is a little milk left in the fridge.

В холодильнике осталось немного молока.

many /'meni/ **A1**

много

a large number of people or things

Many students passed the exam.

Многие студенты сдали экзамен.

me mi: **A1**

меня

used by a speaker to refer to himself or herself as the object of a verb or preposition

She gave me a book.

Она дала мне книгу.

mine maɪn **A1**

мой

belonging to me; the one that belongs to me

"Is this seat taken?" "No, that one is mine."

«Это место занято?» «Нет, то место моё.»

much /mʌtʃ/ **A1**

много

a large amount of something uncountable

There isn't much time left.

Времени осталось немного.

my maɪ **A1**

мой

belonging to or connected with me

This is my book.

Это моя книга.

myself /maɪ'self/ **A2**

себя

used when the speaker is the same person as the subject of the verb

I made the cake myself.

Я сама испекла этот торт.

neither /'naɪðə/ (B2)

ни тот ни другой

not one and not the other of two things or people

Neither of the answers was correct.

Ни один из ответов не был верным.

no nəʊ (A1)

нет

used to say that something is not allowed or does not exist

There is no milk left.

Молока не осталось.

no one /'nəʊ wʌn/ (A2)

никто

not any person; nobody

No one came to the party.

Никто не пришёл на вечеринку.

nobody /'nəʊbədi/ (A2)

никто

no person; not anyone

Nobody answered the door when I knocked.

Когда я постучал, никто не открыл дверь.

nothing /'nʌθɪŋ/ (A1)

ничего

not a single thing; not anything

There's nothing in the fridge.

В холодильнике ничего нет.

nowhere /'nəʊweə/ (B1)

нигде

not anywhere; in or to no place

There was nowhere to sit in the crowded café.

В переполненном кафе не было места, чтобы сесть.

one another /,wʌn ə'nʌðə/ (B1)

друг друга

each other; used to show that each person does something to the other(s)

They love one another.

Они любят друг друга.

other /'ʌðə/ (A1)

другой

different from the one or ones already mentioned

Do you have any other questions?

Есть ли у вас другие вопросы?

our /aʊə/ (A1)

наш

belonging to us; of or relating to the speaker and at least one other person

This is our house.

Это наш дом.

ours /aʊəz/ (A1)

наш

used to refer to something belonging to or associated with us

That house on the corner is ours.

Тот дом на углу – наш.

ourselves /aʊə'selvz/ (A2)

себя

used to refer to the speaker and one or more other people as the object of a verb when they are also the subject

We built the house ourselves.

Мы построили дом сами.

same /seɪm/ (A1)

тот же

identical; not different

We go to the same school.

Мы ходим в одну школу.

several /'sevərəl/ (A2)

несколько

more than two but not very many

I've visited that museum several times.

Я побывал в этом музее несколько раз.

she /ʃi:/ (A1)

она

used to refer to a woman, girl, or female animal already mentioned

She opened the door.

Она открыла дверь.

some /sʌm/ (A1)

некоторые

an unspecified amount or number of something

Can I have some tea, please?

Можно мне немного чая, пожалуйста?

somebody 'sʌmbədi (A2)

кто-то

used to refer to a person whose identity you don't know or don't need to state

Somebody left their bag in the classroom after the lesson.

Кто-то оставил свою сумку в классе после урока.

someone /'sʌmwʌn/ (A1)

кто-то

a person that you do not know the name of

Someone left their bag in the classroom.

Кто-то оставил сумку в классе.

something /'sʌmθɪŋ/ (A1)

что-то

used to refer to a thing that is not known or not named

I need to tell you something important.

Мне нужно сказать тебе кое-что важное.

somewhere /'sʌmweə/ (A2)

где-то

in, at, or to a place that you do not know exactly or do not say exactly

I left my phone somewhere and can't find it.

Я куда-то положила телефон и не могу его найти.

such /sʌtʃ/ (A2)

такой

of the type just mentioned; used to emphasise degree

I've never seen such a beautiful sunset.

Я никогда не видел такого красивого заката.

that /ðæt/ (A1)

тот

used to refer to a person or thing already mentioned or understood

That is a great idea.

Это отличная идея.

their /ðeə/ **A1**

их

belonging to or associated with them

They forgot their tickets.

Они забыли свои билеты.

theirs /ðeəz/ **A2**

их

The possessive pronoun used to refer to something belonging to a group of people already mentioned.

We left our bags here — those bags over there are theirs.

Мы оставили свои сумки здесь — те сумки вот там — их.

them /ðem/ **A1**

их

objective form of 'they'

I saw them at the park.

Я видел их в парке.

themselves /ðəm'selvz/ **A2**

себя

used when the people who are doing an action are also the ones affected by it; used for emphasis

The children dressed themselves this morning.

Дети сами оделись сегодня утром.

these /ði:z/ **A1**

эти

plural of 'this'; used to refer to people or things close to the speaker

These shoes are too small.

Эти туфли слишком малы.

they /ðeɪ/ **A1**

они

used to refer to two or more people or things already mentioned

They are coming tomorrow.

Они приедут завтра.

this /ðɪs/ **A1**

этот

used to refer to something close to you in space or time

This book is really good.

Эта книга очень хорошая.

those /ðəʊz/ (A1)

те

plural of 'that'; used to refer to people or things further away

Those shoes look great on you.

Те туфли тебе очень идут.

us ʌs (A1)

нас

used to refer to the speaker and one or more other people as the object of a verb or preposition

He gave us a present.

Он подарил нам подарок.

we wiː (A1)

мы

used to refer to the speaker and one or more other people

We are going to the park.

Мы идём в парк.

what /wɒt/ (A1)

что

used to ask for information about something

What is your name?

Как тебя зовут?

which /wɪtʃ/ (A1)

который

used in questions or clauses to ask about or identify one from a group

Which colour do you prefer?

Какой цвет тебе нравится больше?

who /huː/ (A1)

кто

used in questions and relative clauses to refer to people

Who is that woman?

Кто эта женщина?

whom /huːm/ (A2)

кого

used instead of 'who' as the object of a verb or preposition

To whom did you send the email?

Кому вы отправили письмо?

whose /hu:z/ (A1)

чей

used to ask which person something belongs to, or to introduce a clause about who owns something

Whose bag is this?

Чья это сумка?

you /ju:/ (A1)

ты

the person or people being spoken to

Can you help me?

Ты можешь мне помочь?

your /jɔ:/ (A1)

твой

belonging to or associated with the person being spoken to

Is this your bag?

Это твоя сумка?

yours /jɔ:z/ (A1)

ваш

used to refer to something that belongs to or relates to the person you are speaking to

Is this bag yours? I found it on the floor.

Эта сумка ваша? Я нашла её на полу.

yourself /jɔ:'self/ (A1)

себя

used to refer back to the person you are speaking to when they are also the object of the action

You should be proud of yourself.

Ты должен гордиться собой.

yourselves /jɔ:'selvz/ (A2)

себя

used when the person or people you are talking to are affected by their own action

You should look after yourselves.

Вы должны заботиться о себе.
